Furnace Inspection


A routine maintenance check each fall will ensure your furnace will run properly during the winter months. It's also a good idea to stock up on furnace filters and change them monthly.

Inspect Windows and Doors for Leaks

Checking and replace if needed, the weather-stripping around the windows and door frames will help prevent heat loss.



Inspect Roof, Gutters, and Downspouts


Prevent Plumbing Freezes

Medicare Minutes

MMAP counselors can assist you with a variety of Medicare or Medicaid issues. Some examples are:

*Explain insurance coverage in simple terms.

*Assist with appeals when there are issues with billing or claims.

*Help apply for assistance for Medicaid or low-income subsidy programs.

*Help finding patient assistance programs.

MMAP Counselors are located at most of our Senior Centers in the U.P. and lower Michigan.

Note: MMAP counselors are available year round to help you with your Medicare/Medicaid issues.

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT SEASON:

Open enrollment season is here. Starting October 15th through December 7th is the time of year to compare your Medicare coverage and change your drug plans, and Medicare Advantage plans for 2026 coverage. This usually takes a few days before the plan finder is 100% accurate, so it will be the following week before we start making appointments for folks who wish to compare plans for 2026.

Each year, drug plans and Medicare Advantage plans can change their coverage, price and more. It is always a good idea to take a look and see if your plan right now will be the best for you in 2026. It is free, and only takes a little time to complete. You will meet with a trained counselor who can assist you with explaining your Medicare options.

We know you get a lot of junk mail, but pay special attention to your mail in the next few months. If it is from your current health insurance company make sure you read it over. They are required to send you notice of the changes to your plan.

Gather together your list of your current medications, and your Medicare cards. If you have mail that you need help understanding, bring that too. This will help us compare for 2026. Then, call the center and schedule an appointment. We will meet one-on-one and give you the tools to make informed decisions regarding your Medicare coverage.






