PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT:

MDSCAA ADULT DAY SERVICES MEMORY CARE PROGRAM

Adult Day Services Memory Care Program is a day program offered to Adults who have been diagnosed with any form of Dementia. The mission of the ADS program is to improve the lives of those who have been diagnosed with Dementia. By offering a therapeutic environment, we allow participants to live their best life. We offer recreational and social events in a safe environment on a daily basis. Our goal is to provide needed comfort for participants and respite time for family and/or caregivers.



The MDSCAA Memory Care Staff include 2 permanent PT Aides, volunteers and a Program Manager. The Staff ratio is four Participants to one Aide depending on participant need.

Colleen Winberg, an ADS Aide who has worked with ADS for 15 years, states, "I feel good that caregivers have a place to bring their loved ones and know they are being well taken care of. My favorite part of my day is listening to participant's stories regarding their life history. We also come up with different games, do exercises, plan and do different projects which they can take home with them which they are very proud of."

Karen Castle, also an ADS Aide who has worked with ADS for over 3 years, and before that, she was a Senior Companion. She informs us that, "At ADS, it has never seemed like work. You find yourself becoming part of an extended family. For me, the best part of my job is getting to know our participants and being able to make them smile. Hearing the Participants laugh and joke with one another can really make your day."

Kristie L. Stenlund, MSN-NP, Program Manager, has been the Program Manager for 3 and half years. She states, "What a pleasure to be able to direct a program that has proven to have such an impact on the individual participant with dementia and their family(s) and/or caregiver(s)." She adds, "The overall health response is evident. We have seen individuals come in with little emotion or wanting to interact with others, to being happy appearing and interactive. It's wonderful. There is a lot of smiling throughout the day and a lot of laughter."

Kristie closes with, "We are very thankful. Caregivers have stated, over and over again, that the support of this Memory Care Program has made a major impact in their lives."

MMAP counselors can assist you with a variety of Medicare or Medicaid issues. Some examples are:

*Explain insurance coverage in simple terms. *Assist with appeals when there are issues with billing or claims. *Help apply for assistance for Medicaid or

low-income subsidy programs.
*Help finding patient assistance programs.

MMAP Counselors are located at most of our Senior Centers in the U.P. and lower Michigan.



Transportation Services: Our center bus runs from approximately 8 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. Monday-Friday. Please call at least a day in advance or more to schedule your ride. We are wheelchair accessible.

Congregate & Home Delivered Meals

Congregate meals are served Monday through Friday from 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. and are meals prepared for take-out.. We ask that you reserve your meal at least a day in advance so we have enough meals prepared.

Home Delivered Meals are for seniors age 60 & over who are assessed to determine their eligibility for the senior nutrition meal program. Call for details if you are interested in this vital service.

The annual "Senior Project Fresh" booklets should be arriving sometime this summer. If you are interested in this coupon booklet for the fresh produce at the farmers markets, please call and put your name on the contact list. Income guidelines do apply for the household. Menominee TEFAP Food Distribution

Next quarterly TEFAP distribution at the Menominee Senior Center is scheduled for 8-11 a.m. on Friday, June 10. As it stands, we will attempt to do a drive-up distribution. If you picked up at the March distribution, you should already be pre-registered. If not, please call us to see if you are eligible, and to be added to the registration to receive your food. You automatically qualify for this commodity distribution if you are enrolled in the CSFP commodity program. If you are interested in guarterly TEFAP commodities distribution, contact your local center to see if you qualify. Anyone over 18 who is a Michigan resident and falls within the income guidelines is eligible.

(For CSFP, you must be age 60 and over and within income guidelines. You will need to certify with the center in advance to qualify.)



We thank you for your continued support during these past few years and we are so happy that we will be able to serve you in person again!




