Historical events for the month of April

April 2, 1513 - Spanish explorer Ponce De Leon sighted Florida and claimed it for the Spanish Crown after landing at the site of present day St. Augustine, now the oldest city in the continental U.S.

April 8, 1974 - Hank Aaron of the Atlanta Braves hits his 715th career home run, breaking Babe Ruth's legendary record of 714 homers.

 April 14, 1865 - President Abraham Lincoln was shot and mortally wounded while watching a performance of Our American Cousin at Ford's Theater in
Washington. He was taken to a nearby house and died the following morning.

April 18, 1906 - The San Francisco Earthquake struck at 5:13 a.m., followed by a massive fire from overturned wood stoves and broken gas pipes. The fire raged uncontrollably for three days resulting in the destruction of over 10,000 acres of property and 4,000 lives lost.

2021 Home Heating Credit and Homestead Property Tax Credit

Do you need help filing your heat and or property tax credits? Please call 786-8850 to schedule a drop off time. Once completed we will call you to pick up your credit paperwork and instructions for mailing. Things to bring to the appointment are: 2021 heating statement, 2021 income statement (social security), pension, interest, etc, 2021 Medigap monthly insurance payments. If applying for property tax credit you will also need your 2021 property tax statements. If you rent (unsubsidized) a formula is used and no tax statement is necessary. People renting from Harbor Tower, West Highland, Willow Creek, Meadowbrook, Les Chenaux Apartments or any subsidized apartment, are not able to file for property tax credit since the apartment owners do not pay taxes on the property. You can file a home heating credit. CALL US!

Easter Crockpot Candy

A colorful, sweet and savory treat for spring.



Ingredients:

34.5 oz honey roasted dry peanuts

48 oz vanilla-flavored candy coating, almond bark, or Candiquik.

11.4 oz M&M's Milk Chocolate Plain (pastel colors) Optional sprinkles


Directions:

Layer peanuts and candy-coating in the crockpot that is at least 5 quarts big.

Cook for one hour on low without removing the lid. After one hour, stir the mixture and continue to

cook stirring every 15-20 minutes for another hour. Line cookie sheets or countertop with parchment paper. Turn off the crockpot, and fold in the

M&M's. Reserve 1/2 cup for decorating. Using a 1 tablespoon scooper or 2 spoons to drop the mixture onto the parchment paper. Make sure candy is not touching one another. Once the entire sheet is scooped, top with the remaining M&M's and sprinkles while the mixture is still warm. Cool completely and store in an airtight container.

Medicare Minutes

MMAP counselors can assist you with a variety of Medicare or Medicaid issues. Some examples are:

 *Explain insurance coverage in simple terms.
*Assist with appeals when there are issues with billing or claims.
*Help apply for assistance for Medicaid or low-income subsidy programs.
*Help finding patient assistance programs.

MMAP Counselors are located at most of our Senior Centers in the U.P. and lower Michigan.



Transportation Services: Our center bus runs from approximately 8 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. Monday-Friday. Please call at least a day in advance or more to schedule your ride. We are wheelchair accessible.

Homestead & Home Heating Credits

We are still helping folks with Michigan Homestead and Home Heating Credits. The April 15th tax deadline does not include these credits. You have until September 30th to file a Home Heating claim, and even longer for a Homestead Credit. This is not a required tax form to file, but is a credit to you if you qualify. For more information, call us.

Congregate & Home Delivered Meals

Congregate meals are served Monday through Friday from 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. and are meals prepared for take-out.. We ask that you reserve your meal at least a day in advance so we have enough meals prepared.

Home Delivered Meals are for seniors age 60 & over who are assessed to determine their eligibility for the senior nutrition meal program. Call for details if you are interested in this vital service.

Menominee TEFAP Food Distribution

Next guarterly TEFAP distribution at the Menominee Senior Center is scheduled for 8-11 a.m. on Friday, June 10. As it stands, we will attempt to do a drive-up distribution. If you picked up at the March distribution, you should already be pre-registered. If not, please call us to see if you are eligible, and to be added to the registration to receive your food. You automatically qualify for this commodity distribution if you are enrolled in the CSFP commodity program. If you are interested in guarterly TEFAP commodities distribution, contact your local center to see if you qualify. Anyone over 18 who is a Michigan resident and falls within the income guidelines is eligible.

Note: Each center has its own dates/times for TEFAP distribution. Contact your local center for more TEFAP details or go to www.mdscaa.org

(For CSFP, you must be age 60 and over and within income guidelines. You will need to certify with the center in advance to qualify.)



MEDICARE MEMO

By Becky Thoune~MMAP Counselor What will happen during my Annual Wellness Visit?

The Annual Wellness Visit (AWV) is a yearly appointment with your primary care provider to create or update a personalized prevention plan. Medicare Part B covers the AWV if you have had Part B for over 12 months and you have not received an AWV or your Welcome to Medicare Visit in the last 12 months. At your Annual Wellness Visit, your doctor may:

- ⇒ Check your height, weight, blood pressure, and other routine measurements
- \Rightarrow Give you a health assessment
- \Rightarrow Review your functional ability and level of safety
- \Rightarrow Learn about your medical & family history
- ⇒ Make a list of your current providers, durable medical equipment suppliers and medications
- \Rightarrow Create a 5-10 year screening schedule
- ⇒ Identity risk factors and current medical & mental heath conditions along with related current or recommended treatments
- ⇒ Screen for cognitive impairment, including diseases such as Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia
- \Rightarrow Screen for depression
- \Rightarrow Provide health advice & referrals

The AWV is NOT a head to toe physical. Medicare Part B covers the AWV with no cost sharing but depending on your visit, you may be responsible for paying a facility fee or cost sharing on any diagnostic services you receive.
