Employee Spotlight


Kevin Belanger works as the Assistant Head Cook at the Gladstone Senior Center.

Tips to enhance your home delivered meals. Try putting food on a regular dinner plate. Add some of your own spices. Reheat instructions are on the back side of your donation summary.





1.5 lbs ground sausage (browned)
2 cups marinara sauce (look for a lowest carb option on the label)
15oz can beef broth
1 cup water
16oz cream cheese (cubed)



4oz canned mushrooms (drained)
2.25 oz canned sliced black olives (drained)
1 tablespoon Italian seasoning
1 cup mini pepperoni (or chopped pepperoni slices)
Mozzarella cheese for garnish

Combine all ingredients in a 6 quart slow cooker. Cook on high for 2-3 hours, or 4-5 hours on low. Top with mozzarella cheese when serving.

Medicare Minutes

MMAP counselors can assist you with a variety of Medicare or Medicaid issues. Some examples are:

*Explain insurance coverage in simple terms.
 *Assist with appeals when there are issues with billing or claims.
 *Help apply for assistance for Medicaid or low-income subsidy programs.

*Help finding patient assistance programs.

MMAP Counselors are located at most of our Senior Centers in the U.P. and lower Michigan.

MEDICARE ADVANTAGE OPEN ENROLLMENT PERIOD STARTING JANUARY 1, 2024

Medicare Advantage plans have a special enrollment period from January 1-March 31. If you were in a Medicare Advantage plan prior to January 1, you can change into another Medicare Advantage plan, or choose to return to original Medicare and pick up a stand-alone drug plan. There are pro's and cons to consider in changing. If you are considering a change, and want more information, a MMAP counselor will be able to help you understand your options.



CSFP commodity distribution takes place bi-monthly in Menominee County every third Tuesday. The next distribution for Menominee Senior Center is set for 11 am-noon on Tuesday, January 16. This will take place in the parking lot on 11th Avenue behind the Holy Spirit Church. This is a drive-up distribution.

(For CSFP, you must be age 60 and over and within income guidelines. You will need to certify with the center in advance to qualify.)

Note: Each center has its own dates/times for CSFP distribution. Contact your local center for more details about the CSFP program. This institution is an equal opportunity provider.

REMINDER: KEEPING YOUR PROOF OF INCOME

In the beginning of the year, if you are receiving Social Security, you will receive letters in the mail that include a 2023 1099 form. Please keep this, and any letters you receive from Social Security regarding your past and current income in a safe place. You should also keep handy your current letter showing your new 2024 Social Security payments. This will be a great help when you need to recertify for services, or for filing your Homestead and Home Heating Credits. These are your best "proofs of income" for your Social Security benefits as they will show your net and gross income.

We usually do not start assisting with Homestead and Home Heating Credits until February, but being prepared makes it easier to file.




